Summary Results of the Household Budget Survey in Urban Areas in Iran – 1383

This report presents data collected by about 13000 sample households living in urban areas throughout the country in 1383 (New statistical base year). The summary results of survey are found as follows:

Household Size

The average size of urban household was 4.13 persons which decreased compared to previous year.

Gross Expenditure ⁽¹⁾

Iranian urban households spent an average of 60344 thousand rials for current annual living expenses in 1383 (about 5029 thousand rials per month).

The above mentioned amount includes the rental equivalence of owner occupied houses, household's payment for income taxes and retirement pensions.

The total expenditure rose by 22.4% compared to 1382.

The share allocated by households to "food and beverages "was 24.8% and that to "tobacco" was 0.4% , "clothing and footwear" was 5.5% , " housing , water , electricity and gas and other fuels" was 26.8% , "furniture, furnishings and household equipment and operation " was 5.5 % , "health expenses and medical care" was 4.1%, " transport" was 15.0%, "communication" was 1.4% , " recreation and culture" was 3.4%, "education"was 1.8%,"restaurant and hotel" was 2.2% and "miscellaneous goods and services " was 8.9% (table 1) .

Gross Income ⁽²⁾

In 1383 the urban households had an annual average gross income⁽³⁾ of 55662 thousand rials (about 4639 thousand rials per month) out of which 74.9% was the share of money income and 25.1% was the share of non – money income .

(1) – Gross Expenditure : The amount of expenses plus household's payment for income taxes and retirement pensions .

(2) – Gross Income : The amount of income less income taxes, retirement pensions (household's share) and earnings by selling the second – hand goods .

(3) – It is possible that the households understate their income.

Comparing with previous year, the annual average of gross income rose by 20.7% (table 2) .

Age Groups

In 1383, as indicated in table 3, about 7.5% of members of households were 5 years old and younger, 7.8% were 6 to 10 years old, 11.1% were 11 to 15 years old, 13.9% were 16 to 20 years old, 20.0% were 21 to 30 years old , 26.1% were 31 to 50 years old and 13.6% were 51 years old and over .

Education⁽¹⁾

Findings of this survey indicate that, out of six years old members and older ones in urban households, 12.8% of them were illiterate, 1.6% of them were capable to read and write, 23.5% had elementary education , 49.4% had secondary education⁽²⁾ and 12.7% had university education (table 4).

Employment

In reported year, 15.5% of the households had no employed member, 57.9% had one – employed member, 20.4% had two – employed member and 6.2% had three and more employed member (table 5) . Compared to the year 1382, the percentage of households with no - employed member and households with one employed member increased, while the percentage of households with two employed member and households with three and more employed member decreased.

Tenure Status

In 1383, the study of tenure status of households shows that 68.3% of households lived in their own dwellings, 22.9% lived in rental houses, 1.2% lived in rented in lieu of services houses and 7.6% lived in free of charge dwellings (table 6).

In 1383 compared to previous year , the percentage of households who lived in their own dwellings and rented in lieu of services houses decreased and percentage of households who lived in rental house increased.

Living Facilities

In 1383, as indicated in table 7, the percentage of households using the living facilities in their dwellings is as follows :

98.1% piped – in water, 99.9% electricity, 81.7% piped – in gas, 22.1% urban sewage system, 83.4% telephone (fixed line) , 94.0% kitchen , 95.2% bathroom , 62.8% fixed air – cooler and 11.0% central heating system .

Household Equipments and Appliances

In reported year the percentage of households using equipments and appliances is as follows :

25.1% personal car, 18.9% motorcycle, 22.4% bicycle, 72.2% sewing machine, 73.8% radio cassette recorder, 98.4% television, 52.3% video and CD – player, 20.6% personal computer , 79.9% refrigerator , 51.1% freezer or fridge- freezer, 98.4% gas cooker, 78.2% vacuum cleaner, 66.1% washing machine and 15.8% mobile phone (table 8).
